Born in Italy in 1983, Christian Fogarolli obtained a degree in archeology in 2007 to then pursuing his historical-artistic studies with a master's degree in 2011 at the University of Trento, alongside a master's degree in diagnostics and restoration of works of art at the University of Verona. Since 2011, he has been dedicated to studies and research of artistic, philosophical, and historical practices. His theoretical and field research unfolds in archival and museum contexts, from which he draws inspiration with the aim of enhancing little-known heritages. His practice develops at the intersection of visual art and scientifc disciplines, investigating how the latter have used the artistic medium to progress. Through historical and archival research, he attempts to deconstruct the binary condition that separates deviance and normality, refecting on the normative attributions of disease, marginalization, and categorization in contemporary society. He works through different forms of expression, from installation to photography, from sculpture to video. Fogarolli's works stimulate critical thinking on the relationship between the mind and the brain, refecting on how the functional processes of the latter interact with the subjective ones of the mind and investigating how these acts of thought develop into behaviors considered lawful or prohibited.

Romina De Novellis (b. 1982, Napoli).

Lives and works in Paris.

Romina De Novellis is a performer, visual artist and anthropologist, born in Naples and grown up in Rome, active in Paris since 2008. After several years dedicated to dance and theater, Romina De Novellis has approached performing arts, studying the body both from an anthropological viewpoint and from the perspective of Mediterranean cultures. The artist uses ecofeminist theories as a parameter to analyze and denounce the oppressive realities of our societies, as well as the dichotomies nature-humanity, femininity-masculinity, North-South, scientific-intuitive, power-bodies and establishment-cultures. Traces of her performances are collected in form of polaroids, photos and videos.

Giuseppe Stampone (b. 1974, Cluses).

Lives and works between Teramo, Brussels and Rome.

His production ranges from multimedia installations and videos to drawings made with a Bic pen, where the medium of drawing becomes a relational device at the center of community building. From his idea was born Solstice Project (www.solstizio.org), realized in collaboration with the European Union and developed in several countries. Since 2002 he has collaborated with artist and life partner Maria Crispal, with whom he shares the Global Education and Solstice Project. In 2021 the Bic company produced the color "Blue Stampone", dedicated to the artist for his drawings made with a Bic pen through which he investigates icons of the past and contemporary. Stampone teaches Painting Techniques at the Academy of Fine Arts in Bologna and collaborates with universities and

academies such as IULM University in Milan, Federico II University in Naples, and the McLuhan Program in Culture and Technology in Toronto. He is an associate member of the American Academy in Rome and the Civitella Ranieri Foundation in New York. In 2020, he is the first Italian winner of the residency at Villa Romana in Florence, funded by Deutsche Bank. In 2013, with L'ABC del Bel Paese, he won the first edition of the "Pacco d'Artista" Award, promoted by Poste Italiane, and his work was reproduced on one hundred thousand of the company's parcels.
